I don't want to go around beating a dead horse here, but it seems to me that the different meanings of the word \"good\" kind of get mixed up. I take it that Pete Seeger means that an aesthetically good song can only achieve morally good things, which is a reasonable enough statement, though not very easy to maintain; I don't see what there was inherently \"wrong\" in any sense of the word when Dylan plugged in.

In the same way, if there is something morally wrong with depicting domestic violence, we might as well dismiss half of the world's literature. In any case, I don't think one should judge a video like this on ethical grounds. Or, to quote Poe: \"With the Intellect or with the Conscience has only collateral relations. Unless incidentally, it has no concern whatever with Duty or with Truth\".
